Thank you to Mr Telford our music teacher for helping the children prepare.

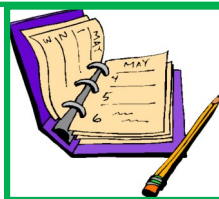

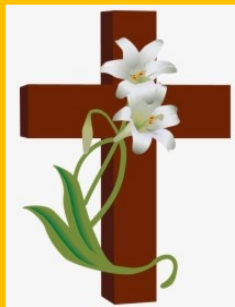

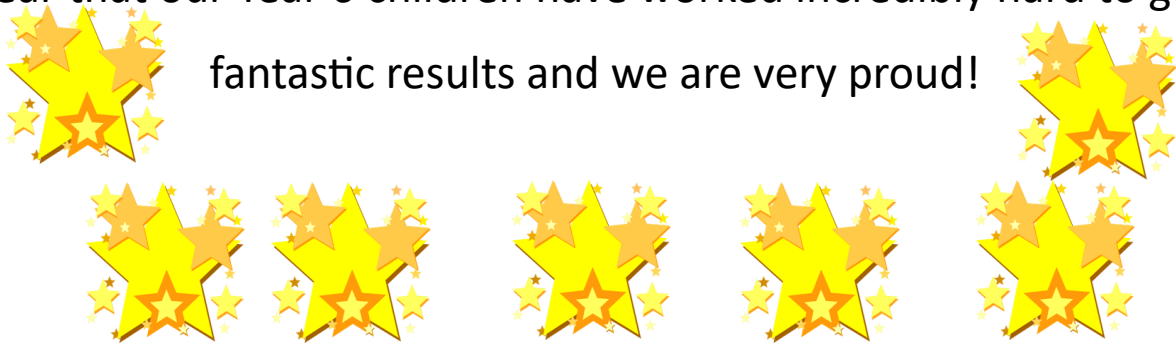




St Patricks Year 6 SATs Results

As you know, passing GCSEs and A levels will help our children to make their way in the world. Year 6 outcomes are a good indicator of how well children will achieve in secondary school. It is an important part of our job to ensure that the children leave St Patrick's being able to read, write and use maths to a high standard.

It is clear that our Year 6 children have worked incredibly hard to get these fantastic results and we are very proud!
