## **REPORT ON THE USE OF PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING    March 2015**

We use pupil premium at St Patrick's for the benefit of children who are disadvantaged.

We spend some of the money on extra teachers of English and Mathematics who in small groups, sets and one to one, or one to two sessions, give the children the targeted tailored support that enables them to reach the same levels of attainment as their peers from more advantaged backgrounds.

The bulk of the rest of the money we spend on specialist provision of music, art and drama. The vision for the school articulated by the governors and staff in 2014 speaks of a "creative and rigorous curriculum" which will deliver success for all of our pupils.

The curriculum needs to be creative and rich so that the children will have their enthusiasm for learning enhanced. The children have told us that they really enjoy our art sessions with our artist in residence. They also speak very enthusiastically about the opportunities for performance and celebration which all the music at the school at the school allows for.

And our specialist actor has enhanced the provision in all year groups making telling contributions to last year's leavers show, to the recent film of Macbeth completed in Year 6, to the work that Year 5 did on the Greek myths and to the storytelling through drama that the children in the infants have been doing.

The enthusiasm for learning generated by the specialist provision has impacted on children's achievement in English and Maths. All the specialists have linked some of their lessons to these core areas, and the experience of success that some children gain through high quality provision in the arts allows them to imagine being successful in other areas of study.

Our strategies are broadly successful as the tables attached to this report show.
