Word Aware Day

On Thursday we had great fun dressing up and learning new vocabulary! We had circle time where we discussed our words, chose a book from 'The Book Project' and re-told the story of Jack and the Beanstalk through junk modelling.



If a child is read to daily, they will have heard approximately 296,660 words by the time they are five years old. If a child is read 5 books a day, they will have heard approximately 1,483,300 words by the time they are 5 years old. Exposure to vocabulary is good for all children.

How can you help your child with their learning?

Reception phonics



Cross the river

Choose a selection of objects with two or three sounds (cap, cup, dog). There can be more than one of the same objects.

Make a river across the floor or ground outside with chalk or ropes. Give your child an object and check that they know the names of the objects. The toy calls out the name of an object in sound-talk (e.g. p-e-g). They blend the sounds to make the word and cross the river.

Maths

This week we have been learning about length (longest and shortest.) Draw around your foot and measure with objects like spoons, Lego bricks or sticks.

Can you guess who has the longest foot? Who has the shortest foot?
