History - Year 3 Trip to The British Museum

On Monday, Year 3 visited the British Museum to explore the Ancient Egyptian artefacts. They had a workshop about 'Daily life in Ancient Egypt.' The children learnt about the importance of the river Nile, the lesser known gods and goddess, that were important to different families, and the toys and games children used to play with. They then compared things in Ancient Egypt to their own lives. Year 3 saw some Ancient Egyptian handwriting, and also visited the mummies exhibit.

Moving On is aimed at adults, rather than children, and any children attending are the sole responsibility of their parents. [Register for our Moving On event.](#)

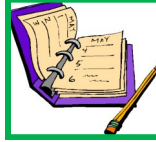
