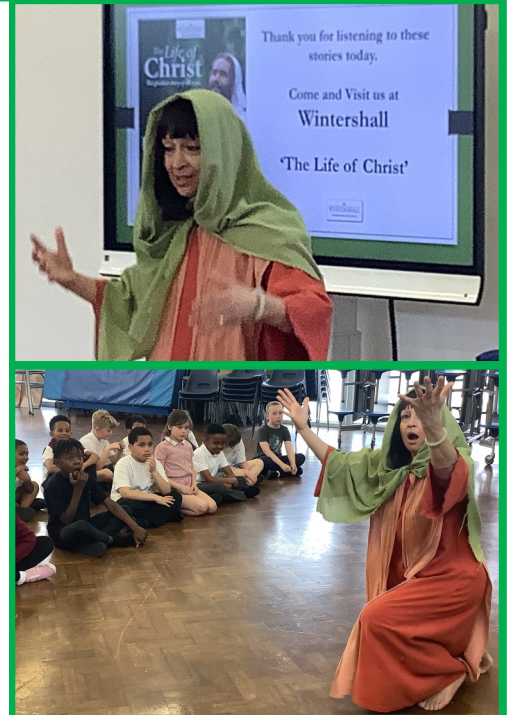

Religious Education - Year 3 visit from the Wintershall actors

This week Year 3 had a special visit from the **Wintershall actors**. They children saw the story of the **Leper woman** played out in front of them, then had a chance to reflect on what they had seen, and how it could influence their choices in life today.

The Wintershall actor, Sybil, was then kind enough to share information about the Wintershall Estate in Surrey and how they perform life re-enactments of stories about **Jesus life - from his birth right up to the Ascension**, which was celebrated this week.

Every year in June, Wintershall host a family day where families are welcome to attend the whole day seeing the life of Jesus re-enacted across the beautiful Wintershall Estate.



We explicitly teach the children that if something happens that makes them upset, they should look at this poster (which is around the school) and check: **Is it rude? Is it mean? Or is it bullying?** It is important we use the correct words.

We encourage the children to be careful when using the word 'bullying'

It only becomes bullying when the behaviour is **intentionally hurtful** and **repeated over a period of time**.

We tell children that **physical, verbal, emotional, racist, homophobic, transgender** or **online** abuse can all happen without it being 'bullying', but **intentionally hurtful** and **repeated behaviours** are **NOT OK**.

Please remind your child:

- There is nothing wrong with them if they are being bullied, it can happen to anyone.
- It is not their fault, but there are things they can do about it!

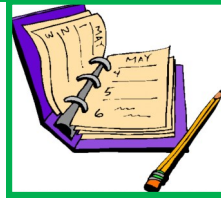
Remind your child that they must **always tell an adult in school** if they see or experience rude, mean or bullying behaviour.
