Year 6 visit The RAF Museum

As part of Year 6's History curriculum, they have been learning about World War 2. They travelled to the RAF Museum and took part in Air Raid Shelter Workshop. They learnt about the importance of the soldiers in the Army and how they kept people safe during the war. They also looked at the war plane replicas and discovers different facts about each plane.
