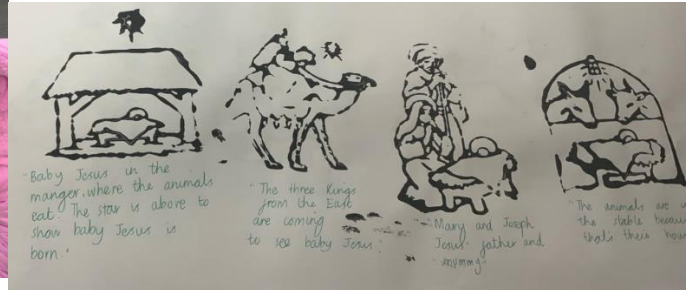


What have we been learning?

This week in EYFS, we've been immersing ourselves in the Christmas story by retelling the Nativity using key vocabulary such as stable, manger, camel, The Three Kings, Mary, Joseph, Jesus, and Innkeeper. The children have loved using the Nativity small world figures and stable to act out the story, as well as stamping key events with printing ink.



In Maths, we've been learning how to compose numbers 1 to 5 by breaking them into two parts. We played a fun game with beanbags where the children selected a number (the whole), threw the beanbags towards a hoop, and counted how many landed inside versus outside. This activity sparked great discussions about number parts and helped reinforce their understanding. A festive week of learning and play! 🎄 ✨

Reception children can practice counting forwards to 10 using a number line. Simply tell them a number, and ask them to put their finger on it – a great way to build number recognition!
