This week, Year 5 have been doing some very tricky maths work on fractions.

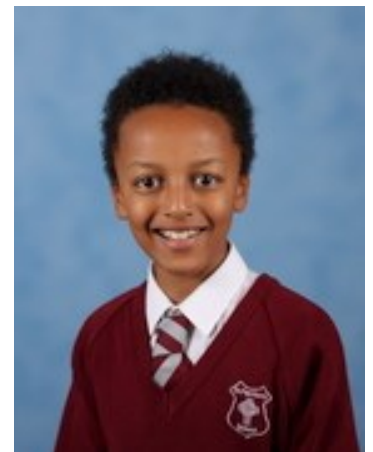
Azaryas has displayed a fantastic understanding of multiplying fractions. He is able to confidently
