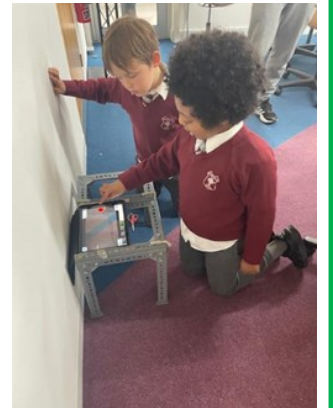


Swimming is not only fun, but it's also an essential life skill that promotes confidence and safety in the water. Keep up the great work!
