## Dear Parents and Carers,

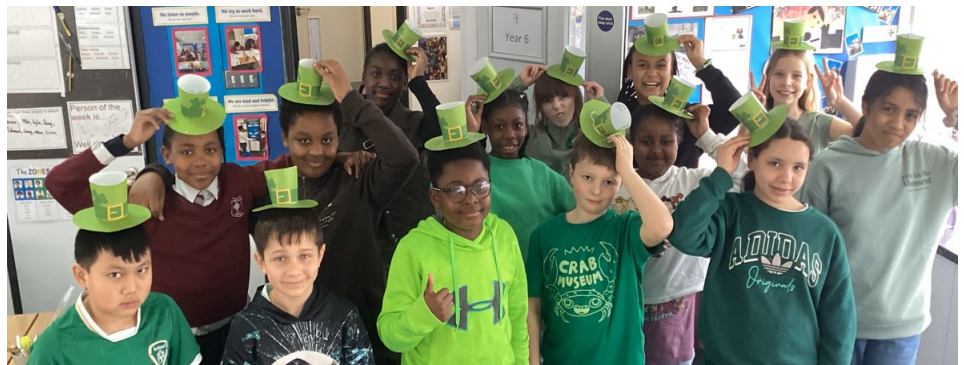

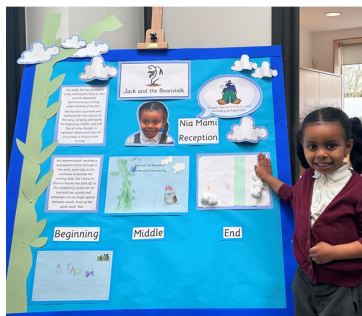
## Work of the week...
