

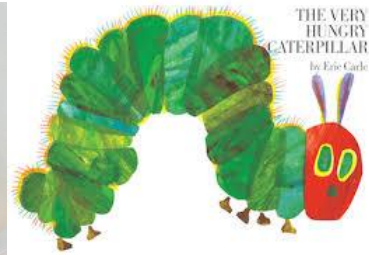
## What have we been learning?

## Camden Kids Talk

This week's Stay and Play session was all about building children's memory and helping them reflect on past experiences—particularly through the exciting theme of *Holidays*! We explored how talking about past events and imagining future ones helps children make sense of the world around them.

Children took part in a variety of engaging holiday-themed activities that encouraged them to investigate, explore, and ask questions. From fishing for numbered fish with rods and nets, to packing suitcases for Teddy's next adventure, each activity was designed to spark curiosity and develop language through play.

A special highlight was creating a "suitcase" using junk modelling resources and craft materials, which children took home to continue the memory game with their families. We modelled how to use descriptive language and action words in different tenses—past, present, and future—by using fun phrases like "*I wonder...*" and "*I think...*", and encouraging full sentences with "*because...*"
