Thank you for your understanding — let's make it a night to remember!

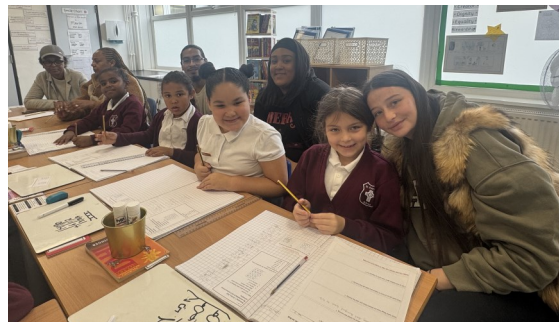
