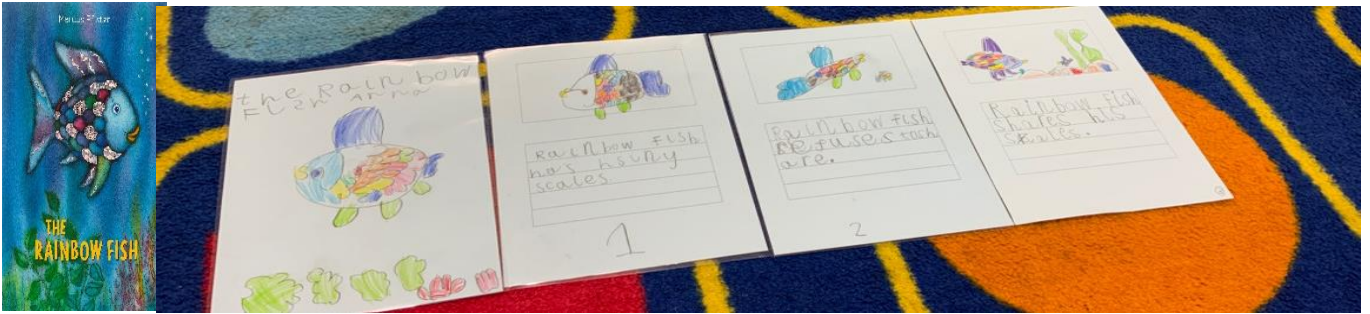


What have we been learning?

Over the past two weeks, Reception have been busy writing their own *Rainbow Fish* stories. They planned, wrote and illustrated the beginning, middle and end of their books, focusing on the moral of sharing and developing a clear understanding of the plot. Their finished stories even include front covers and page numbers just like real authors!



This week in Maths, we have been focusing on the numbers 6, 7 and 8. The children have been identifying different representations of these numbers, including dot patterns, ten frames and fingers. They then had a go at using bingo dabbers to show different ways to make numbers on a ten frame, such as $3 + 3 = 6$, $2 + 4 = 6$ and $5 + 1 = 6$. A great hands-on week of number exploration!

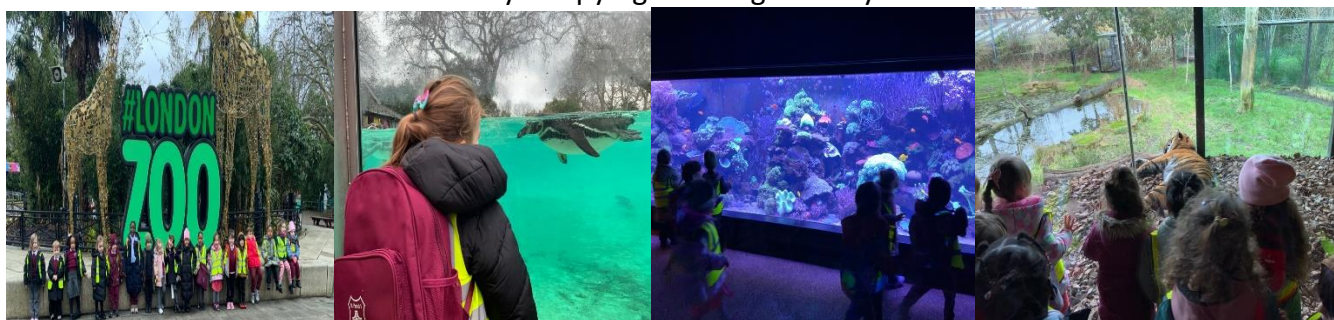
