Every week a fantastic piece of children's work is showcased in the school lobby (next to the office).



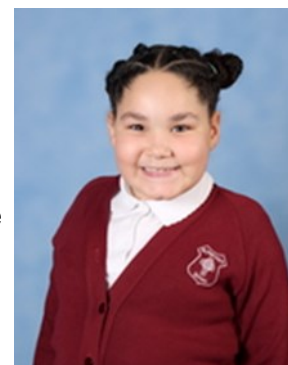
Last half term, **Year 3** read the book **Dinosaurs and all That Rubbish** as part of their "Looking After Our World" studies.

Essie has been chosen as Work of the Week for the high-quality letter she wrote.

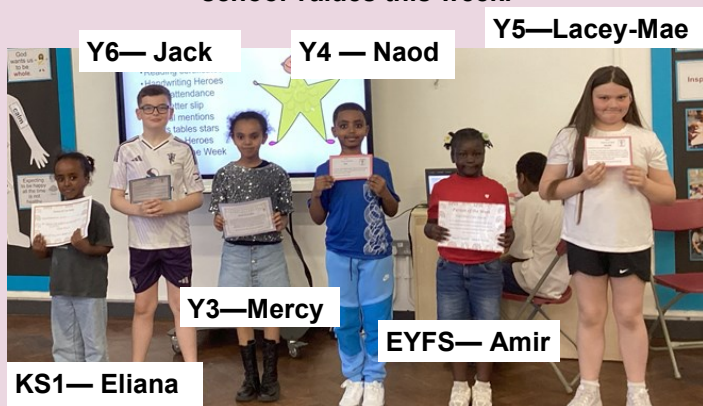
